

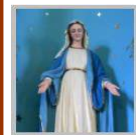

VOLUNTEER POSITIONS AVAILABLE!

Do you have a love for God and your Catholic Faith? Do you have a desire to share your faith with others? Do you enjoy working with children?

If you answered “yes” to these questions, please consider teaching or serving as an aide or office assistant in our *Religious Education Program*! Our Religious Education Program serves children in Levels 1 through 7 by forming them in their relationship with Jesus Christ, cultivating and nurturing their knowledge and practice of the Catholic faith, and preparing them for reception of the Sacraments of Reconciliation, Eucharist, and Confirmation.

We have openings in our Tuesday evening weekly program for both elementary and middle school class levels. Applicants must be practicing Catholics, living in accord with Catholic teachings, and have a love for God and the Catholic Faith. They should be 18 or older and be able to relate to and work with children. While prior experience teaching is always beneficial, it is not required. Responsibilities for the Catechist position include preparing and teaching lessons for a class of roughly 20 children using published and prescribed materials provided by the program, and maintaining periodic email communication with families. For our weekly program, applicants must be available Tuesday evenings from 6:00 – 7:30 PM, September through May. Full materials, training, support, and certification for the Catechist position are provided to every volunteer in order to equip them for this position. Background checks and adherence to the Archdiocesan Safe Environment Program are required.

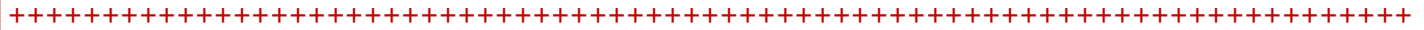


August 13 - Knights Founder, Blessed Fr. McGivney Feast Day



Father Michael J. McGivney, a humble parish priest and founder of the Knights of Columbus, was beatified on Oct. 31, 2020, in his home Archdiocese of Hartford, Conn. In the apostolic letter read at the Mass, Pope Francis noted that the "zeal for the proclamation of the Gospel and generous concern for the needs of his brothers and sisters made him an outstanding witness of Christian solidarity and fraternal assistance."

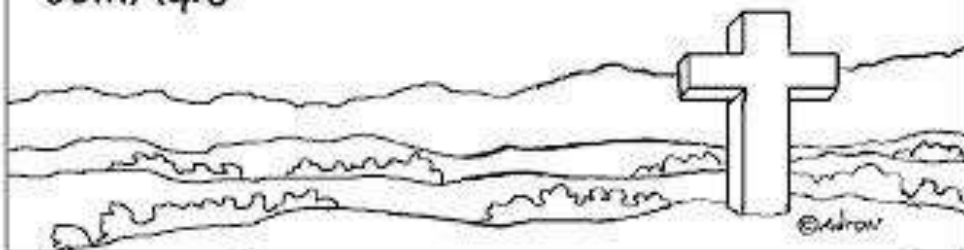
Entering into eternal life two days past his 38th birthday, in the midst of a flu pandemic, he is the third-youngest American saint or blessed. A priest for 13 years, he was only the third born in the United States to be beatified, and could become the first US-born male to be canonized as a saint.

Today, Father McGivney stands as a model for both priests and laypeople, having lived a life of heroic virtue devoted to the people of God, and as the founder of a Knights organization that has grown to more than 2 million members worldwide.

WE REMEMBER
