

FASTING & ABSTINENCE Ash Wednesday and Good



Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Latin Catholic Church, fasting is obligatory from age 18 through age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. Abstinence from meat on Lenten Fridays applies to all aged 14 and above.

Requirements for Sponsorship

The Code of Canon Law specifies the requirements for serving as a godparent or sponsor. Canon Law (Church Law) references are Canons 851.2, and 872-874. Godparents and sponsors must meet all of the following requirements, so please review them carefully before choosing godparents and sponsors.

The requirements to be a godparent/sponsor:

Must be someone other than the parent of the one to be baptized.

Must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, and Confirmation.

Must be at least 16 years of age.

If there will be two Godparents (for Baptism), one must be male and one must be female.

A Godparent/sponsor must be leading a life in harmony with the faith and the role to be undertaken; therefore, if married, must be married in the Church. If single, must be striving to live a chaste life and cannot be living with a person outside of marriage.

Must be a practicing Catholic, registered in a parish, who regularly attends Mass on Sundays and Holy Days and receives the Holy Eucharist. Registration in their local parish is encouraged so that they may participate fully in the life of the Church through their parish.



NOTES TO STATEMENTS OF INCOME AND EXPENSES

- 1. Additions to Church/Convent This amount includes the labor and materials costs expended after June 30, 2023 for the addition of a pitched rooftop on the convent, outdoor lighting for the back parking lot, and replacing a section of gutters on the Church .
- 2. Tuition Income This amount represents the net amount of tuition we received from school families and from outside tuition assistance sources (BLOCS, private scholarships, etc.). It should be noted that unfunded discounts are offered directly by St. Helena. For the 2023 - 2024 school year, St. Helena offered the following amounts in unfunded discounts: \$557,550 for qualified parishioners, \$216,615 in multi-child discounts for parishioners, and \$24,125 in various other unfunded discounts or financial aid paid by the parish.
- Additions to School This amount represents costs associated with installing a new ductless heating system in the cafeteria and a new compressor for the gym.





2025 is the Jubilee Holy Year, the 2,025th anniversary of the Incarnation of our Lord, an "event of great spiritual, ecclesial, and social significance in the life of the Church." 
